PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

MCHS Vision Statement: "Every student will graduate college and career capable."

Safety, relationships, inclusive culture, communication, and adaptability all fuel learning and move us towards fulfillment of our vision. As our vision statement clearly indicates, we are committed to the success of every student at MCHS. Although our focus has always been on providing the supports and structures to meet the many varied needs of all of our students, never before has this been of greater importance.

First, I hope this message finds you and your entire family both safe and healthy. I certainly understand that the last several months have been a challenging time period for our families in so many ways that impact their daily lives and the lives of those they love. We empathize with the struggles our families have and continue to endure. Additionally, we recognize the fact that the necessity to transition to online learning in the spring presented circumstances that were not without difficulties for some of our students.

With the start of the 2020–21 school year quickly approaching, our commitment to learning at the highest level for every student is the priority. We do fully understand that we are going to have to provide a learning environment that meets the safety, social, emotional, and instructional needs that will support all of our students. In whatever model circumstances dictate that instruction needs to be delivered during the upcoming school year, we will put every measure in place to ensure that our students have the following:

- Safety – taking all precautions possible and placing systems in place to safeguard the health of our students, faculty and staff as we know Covid-19 is central to most of our thoughts
- Relationships – continuing our emphasis on building positive/healthy adult to student relationships that will support the social-emotional needs of our students
- Inclusive Culture – we know we must address the larger societal issue of systemic racism and the impact it has on our entire MCHS community. We have already begun to hold conversations with groups of individuals. We will continue to listen, learn and take actions to elicit positive change.
- Communication – we pledge to provide the information you will need in as timely a fashion as possible. We know that sharing critical information, timely, with our families is essential.
- Adaptability – we understand how vital it is to be able to adapt to any circumstances that are presented knowing that we will need to be flexible in our approach to provide optimal learning.

As we move towards the start of the 2020-2021 school year continuing to foster and nurture the learning process for all students while adjusting "our approach" as necessary to meet the needs of the "whole student" and our families is crucial. In this process we will continue to move forward as we offer over 20 advanced placement courses, dual enrollment options, a wide array of career and technical education programs and a rich full selection of courses in the performing and visual arts. This year we will have approximately 300 students in grades 9-12 that will be in our Advancement via Individual Determination (AVID) classes as a four year AVID school. In our second year as a Cambridge school offering Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE) coursework we will add approximately 200 new students to our 125 students from last year's cohort who will be in a position to earn college credit as well as the prestigious AICE diploma, which is recognized by colleges worldwide.

We will maintain a focus on our vision: "Every student will graduate college and career capable." In these very "uncertain" times, I want to provide you the certainty that our students and our families and their success and well-being will continue to be at the heart of every action taken by every faculty and staff member at MCHS.

STUDENT VOLUNTEERING

Remember, this is a student-generated process. Students are responsible for getting confirmation and approval as stated in the requirements listed on the website. Parents and staff members may not submit these forms.

DUAL ENROLLMENT

The Dual Enrollment Registration deadline for Fall 2020 is July 31, 2020. A 3.0 GPA and completion of four high school courses are required. The PERT has been temporarily suspended for Fall 2020 for entry level courses SLS1101 and CGS1060 only. To be eligible for DE classes other than these, course enrollment requires having the necessary PERT score on file. Students may also qualify using the Alternate Placement Method. PROOF OF RESIDENCY

Based on the District policy, all students with a change of address after enrollment must provide proof of residency. Two documents in the parents or legal guardian's name are required. Documents accepted are current utility bill, current year property tax bill, deed of home, current and signed lease, mortgage, complete automobile insurance policy, DL with current address, home purchase contract, and declaration of domicile.

All incoming 9th graders must provide proof of residency.

REGISTRATION

Your student must be a resident of Martin County AND live in the MCHS Attendance Zone.

TRANSCRIPTS

Please be advised that you must apply to the college before requesting transcripts. Transcripts sent electronically are free; transcripts that must be mailed are \$2.00 each. Transcript fees are placed on your fees list. Unofficial transcripts can be printed from a student's focus account at home.

Current students, log into your Classlink account, then click the MCHS website link. Once there, click on departments and then click on Registrar. There is a "Request Transcripts" link to fill out an online request for transcript. You can send as many as you would like. If there is a \$2 fee, it will be billed to your account.

STUDENT PARKING PROCESS & REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

In order to secure a parking spot on campus, students must meet the following requirements:

- Student is in 12th or 11th grade according to FOCUS
- Must have a cumulative unweighted GPA of 2.0 or higher
- Valid driver's license (not a learner's permit)
- Vehicle registration to you or your parent/guardian
- Cleared of all school obligations (obligations can be paid via check and sent through mail to Attn: Mrs. Fran Howard, Bookkeeper)
- Completed application submitted to the Dean's office by the end of the first week of school (application can be found on the school's website and can be submitted electronically to mchsparking@martinschools.org)
- \$50 parking fee - due at time of ID pick up

Juniors who meet the above requirements are eligible to submit their intent to obtain a parking spot from July 6-20 through the school's website. Seniors who have not already submitted their intent to obtain a parking spot will also be eligible to submit their intent during this time.

We **WILL NOT** hold a "first-come, first-serve" system in selecting a spot. Instead, a school administrator will do a recorded video picking out student's 4300 number at random based on their grade level and GPA.

STUDENT IDs

All students will be issued one free photo ID card. IDs must be worn at all times visibly on front upper torso. Students who do not carry the card as required or who do not present this card to a member of the school staff when asked to do so may face disciplinary action. Students who alter their ID card will be required to purchase a new card. If the card is lost, it must be replaced immediately at the Dean's Office at a cost of \$5.00. In addition to being required for identification purposes during the school day, students will need ID cards to leave campus, if pre-approved for off-campus privileges or Dual Enrollment, to check-out library books and textbooks, to participate in the Laptops for Learning program, to use the computers in the library/media center, to purchase tickets for admittance to the prom, and to attend other school events.

DRESS CODE - PLEASE READ BEFORE SHOPPING

Students have the right to learn without being offended or distracted by the way other people are dressed. Students have the responsibility to dress neatly, be clean and well groomed, and avoid dressing in a manner that offends or distracts others. These samples are not all-inclusive but should serve as a guide for Martin County High School students. When a student's appearance at school or at a school-sponsored activity violates the dress code, the parent may be requested to bring alternative clothing and/or the student will be subject to disciplinary action. The following dress code is consistent with the minimum standards set by the school district, but also contains a few additional ones as well, and is in effect from the time a student arrives on campus until he/she has left campus.

1. Shirts must have a collared or crew neck. Clothing that exposes the torso is not allowed. The length of shirts may not exceed the wrists when arms are fully extended. If shirts are longer than the student's wrists when arms are extended, the shirt must be tucked in. Collar shirts with buttons must not have more than 2 buttons from the neckline un-buttoned, even if there is a shirt worn underneath. Sleeveless shirts must cover to the edge of the shoulder and show no undergarments. This includes school athletic uniforms worn during the school day. No messages, pictures, symbols or clothing may be worn or displayed which portray ideas that are harmful to the health, safety, and welfare of students, e.g., messages which relate to drugs, smoking, alcohol, sex, gangs, profanity or violence. The following examples which are considered to be unacceptable, but are not limited to: tube tops, tank tops, spaghetti straps and halters, bare back or midriff clothing, skin-tight clothing, see-through clothing, and bathing suits.
2. Skirts, skorts, and dresses may not be shorter than 2 inches from the top of the knee. Shorts may not be shorter than 4 inches from the top of the knee. Board shorts aka boys' bathing suits or soffes are not allowed.
3. Pants, jeans and slacks must be worn to the top of the hipbone or higher. All garments with belt loops must be secured and belted at the hip, must not be baggy or oversized, and the hem of pant legs must not drag on the ground.
4. Clothing which is not worn appropriately, not properly fastened, has tears, holes, or is frayed (even if something is worn underneath) will not be permitted. Undergarments shall not be exposed, i.e. boxer shorts, underwear, bras.
5. Leggings are only permitted if they are covered by a dress, skirt, skort, or shorts that are in dress code length (skirts, skorts, and dresses may not be shorter than 2 inches from the top of the knee; shorts may not be shorter than 4 inches from the top of the knee), otherwise they will be considered out of dress code.
6. No clothes or accessories with metal studs, spikes, ornaments, chains, or other objects which can scratch furniture, damage property, or cause harm to oneself or others may be worn.
7. Pajamas nor slippers shall be worn to school-they are out of dress code.
8. Shoes must be worn at all times. For safety reasons, tap shoes, shoes with cleats or shoes with wheels may not be worn. Shoes with built in containers are prohibited. Shoes with laces and/or straps must be secured at all times. Athletic shoes may be required for Physical Education classes.
9. No hairstyle, jewelry, or tattoo that is a distraction to the learning environment is allowed.
10. Blankets are not allowed on campus.

ABSENCES

MCHS will provide a safe and friendly environment which is conducive to student learning. In accordance with Florida law and school board rules, the school is designed to operate toward high levels of student achievement, which can only be realized when each student is in school, on time, and participating in every class, every day. It is the responsibility of every parent and student to uphold and abide by the attendance policies.

Parents will receive a recorded message to notify them of their student's absence. The absence must be explained in writing within ten (10) days of the student's return to school. Failure to provide such certification by the tenth day will result in the absence being "unexcused". Please know that your child's appeal may be denied if not received within this time frame.

TARDY POLICY

Tardy to School- Students arriving to school after 8:20am must report to the Attendance Office. Students with an unexcused tardy to 1st block will receive an After School Detention. MCHS allows each student three (3) excused tardies with a parent note per semester. Any tardies beyond the 3rd excused tardy will be required to serve a detention.

Tardy to Class- Students who are tardy to class will receive an After School Detention from the Dean's office for each tardy. Being on time to class is defined as being in class and ready to begin work when the tardy bell rings.

OFF CAMPUS PASSES & EARLY CHECK-OUTS

If your child has an appointment or when a student needs to leave campus earlier than the scheduled end of the school day, the student should bring a note to the Attendance Office, prior to class starting at 8:20 am. The student will be given a pass to leave class at the designated time and an Off Campus pass will be at the Front Desk for the student to pick up. All notes must have a valid parent telephone number to verify the request, the time the student is leaving, and who is picking up the student. The parent will be contacted to confirm the issuance of the note. In the event the parent/guardian cannot be contacted, a pass will not be issued. Leaving school grounds without a pass will result in a referral to the Dean's Office.

Only students with a medical (dental) excuse or court appointment are permitted to leave school and return. Documentation is required upon return. Any person picking up a student, must be on the student's Emergency Contact card prior to the day they are being picked up.

Early check out ends at 2:35 p.m. and 11:35 a.m. on early release days.

LAPTOPS FOR LEARNING

Student learning is at the heart of all we do. The goal of the Laptops for Learning program in the Martin County School District is to enhance student education by ensuring that each high school student has a digital device. MCHS has embraced this opportunity for our students as it offers an additional tool to assist with collaboration, research, immediate feedback and engagement in the learning process.

Anyone in need of a laptop may pick up their laptops on **August 7, from 1:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m.** in the media center. Bring the completed registration form, \$25, and student ID or 4300#. Incoming ninth graders will keep their issued laptop from middle school.
