

# JBHS Registration for 2019-2020 School Year

A How To for Registration and Important Information  
regarding Graduation Requirements

# Registration Forms/Process

- You will be called out individually through the following classes:
  - **Class of 2020** - *English*, begin meeting week of **January 28, 2019**
  - **Class of 2021** - *World History*, begin meeting week of **February 4, 2019**
  - **Class of 2022** - *English*, begin meeting week of **February 11, 2019**
- Please make sure you are ready to meet with your counselor by having your registration form filled out completely by the appropriate date listed above. If your form is not completed when you meet with your counselor you must return the completed form to guidance on your own time. Please note your preferred elective may no longer be available the longer you wait.

# Registration Forms/Process

- You will receive your registration form and elective choices approximately two weeks before you are scheduled to begin meeting with the counselors. This will allow you adequate time to have your teachers recommend your next class placement.
- When you meet with your counselor please make sure you have a teacher signature for each class(unless you are selecting a class that has no pre-requisite), 3 elective choices, 3 alternate elective choices, and a parent signature.
- You will be meeting your school counselor in the lobby upstairs or downstairs in Building 4.

# Registration Forms/Process

- Two years of JROTC will satisfy the HOPE credit and/or the Fine Art credit.
- New Dual Enrollment students still need to complete the form with 7 course selections. We will make adjustments once the schedule for Dual Enrollment is made.
- Please note: Students will be placed into Intensive Reading based upon FSA ELA scores received during the summer and this may affect your elective selections. If you are using an ACT/SAT concordant score, please make sure to bring in a copy of your score report to guidance.



# Graduation Requirements

- To be eligible for High School Graduation, a student must satisfy all three of the following categories\*:
  - **CREDITS**
    - Must have a minimum of 24 Credits
  - **GPA**
    - Must have a minimum of a 2.0 Cumulative GPA (un-weighted)
  - **Assessments**
    - Must pass the English Language Arts FSA and Algebra 1 EOC
    - May use concordant scores from SAT or ACT to fulfill these requirements

# Required Credits to Graduate

- 4 Credits English Language Arts (ELA)
- 4 Credits Mathematics
  - One credit must be in Algebra 1 and one must be in Geometry
- 3 Credits Science
  - One credit must be in Biology 1
- 3 Credits Social Studies
  - One credit in World History
  - One credit in US History
  - One credit in Government/Economics (0.5 credit each)
    - **Must complete a financial literacy component of economics to count for graduation**
- 1 Credit Fine Art
  - Can be any of the following: Band, Chorus, Art, Drama, Debate, DIT, Drafting, Engineering, TV Pro
- 1 Credit HOPE
- 8 Elective Credits
- 1 Online Course

# Economics with Financial Literacy

- Options on how to complete this credit
  - Economics with Financial Literacy at JBHS or FLVS
  - Economics with Financial Literacy Honors at JBHS or FLVS
  - AP Macroeconomics at JBHS
  - ECO2013 at IRSC WITH any one of the following:
    - Foolproof online enrichment program
    - Personal and Family Finance on FLVS
    - FIN1100 at IRSC

# Assessments

- Must **PASS** Grade 10 English Language Arts FSA
  - You will keep taking it until you pass or get the concordant score on the SAT or ACT
- Must **PASS** Algebra I EOC
  - You will keep taking it until you pass or get the concordant score on the math PERT
  - Counts as 30% of final grade
- Must **TAKE** the Geometry EOC
  - Counts as 30% of final grade
  - You must pass this exam to be considered for scholar designation
- Must **TAKE** the Biology EOC
  - Counts as 30% of final grade
  - You must pass this exam to be considered for scholar designation
- Must **TAKE** the U.S. History EOC, unless you take it at IRSC or AP
  - Counts as 30% of final grade
  - You must pass this exam to be considered for scholar designation





# Scholar Designation

- In addition to meeting the 24-credit standard high school diploma requirements a student must:
  - Earn 1 credit in Algebra 2
  - Earn 1 credit in Statistics or an equally rigorous mathematics course
  - Pass the Geometry EOC
  - Pass the Biology 1 EOC
  - Earn 1 credit in Chemistry or Physics
  - Earn 1 credit in a course equally rigorous to Chemistry or Physics
  - Pass the U.S. History EOC
  - Earn 2 credits in the same world language
  - Earn at least 1 credit in Advanced Placement (AP), IB, AICE or a Dual Enrollment course.

# World Language

- World Language is **NOT REQUIRED** for your high school diploma
- World Language **IS REQUIRED** for the Bright Futures Scholarship and admission into a four year university.
  - Must be two credits of the same foreign language

# Bright Futures Scholarship

- Requirements are subject to change for every graduation class.
- Requirements and award amounts will be available the summer before your senior year.
  - For the class of 2020, requirements will be available in the summer of 2019.
- Apply online after October 1 of your SENIOR year
- Three Levels of Awards
  - Florida Academic Scholar
  - Florida Medallion Scholar
  - Gold Seal Vocational Scholar
- All Requirements, including service hours, must be met by graduation except for test scores. Test scores from the June Administration of your senior year will be accepted.

# Florida Academic Scholars Requirements for the Class of 2019

- 3.5 weighted GPA based on 16 credits
  - 4 Math, 4 English, 3 Science, 3 Social Science, 2 Foreign Language
- SAT score of 1290 or ACT Composite score of 29
- 100 Community Service Hours
- 2 years of the same Foreign Language

# Florida Medallion Requirements for the Class of 2019

- 3.0 weighted GPA based on 16 credits
  - 4 Math, 4 English, 3 Science, 3 Social Science, 2 Foreign Language
- SAT score of 1170 or ACT Composite score of 26
- 75 Community Service Hours
- 2 years of the same Foreign Language

# Gold Seal Vocational Requirements for the Class of 2019

- 3.0 weighted GPA based on 16 credits
  - 4 Math, 4 English, 3 Science, 3 Social Science, 1 Fine/Performing Art, 1 HOPE
- 3.5 unweighted GPA from 3 credits in one vocational program (Engineering, Drafting, etc...)
- SAT scores of 24 in Reading, 25 in Writing, and 24 in Math or
- ACT scores of 17 in English, 19 in Math, 19 in Reading or
- PERT scores of 106 in Reading, 103 in Writing, 114 in Math
- 30 Community Service Hours
- No language requirement

# Volunteer Hours

- NOT REQUIRED FOR GRADUATION
- REQUIRED FOR SCHOLARSHIPS
- All volunteer hours are now submitted electronically through the Student Community Service site. Please visit [martinschools.org](http://martinschools.org) and click on Parents and Students, then click on Student Community Service for more information.
- All hours must be received by graduation

# Dual Enrollment Requirements

- Must have an UNWEIGHTED GPA of 3.0
- Must have passing scores on PERT, ACT or SAT
  - ACT: English 17, Reading 19, Math 19
  - SAT: Writing and Language Subtest 25, Reading 24, Math 24
  - PERT: Reading 106, Writing 103, Math 114
  - To sign up for the PERT, apply to IRSC online (choose Dual Enrollment as applicant type) and review the times when the IRSC testing center is open.
  - If you are using the ACT or SAT as your scores, you MUST order official score reports to IRSC from the Collegeboard or ACT directly.

Registration Ends on April 26<sup>th</sup> for Summer

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# Dual Enrollment Procedures

Consult with your high school counselor. Make sure you meet the requirements of 3.0 unweighted GPA for college credit courses or 2.0 unweighted GPA for technical education courses.

Sign Program Agreement (Form # 508) with High School Counselor

- Turn in form 508 to IRSC to complete application process. (First time DE students only)
- Apply online to IRSC to receive your IRSC student id. You must select Dual Enrollment as applicant type.
- Take the PERT (Postsecondary Education Readiness Test) at IRSC or order official scores from Collegeboard or ACT to be sent to IRSC

Register on-line at [www.irsc.edu](http://www.irsc.edu) for desired courses during registration period and before district deadlines.

- Click on Workday
- Students are responsible for ensuring that the times of classes do not conflict with the times the student is enrolled in high school courses.

Bring printout of online registration/"shopping cart" and IRSC transcript (if you have taken previous DE classes) to meet with your high school guidance counselor.

- Counselor will complete the Dual Enrollment Admission /Registration form (form #68) (must match your online registration / "shopping cart" EXACTLY.)

Take the Dual Enrollment Admission /Registration Form (form #68) to IRSC. **REGISTRATION IS NOT COMPLETE UNTIL YOU DO THIS STEP. MUST BE COMPLETED BY POSTED DISTRICT DEADLINES.**

Return IRSC paperwork (Student Class Schedule and exemption form) to Guidance.

- High school counselor will sign and return class schedule to the student.

Bring signed IRSC paperwork to the Dual Enrollment Bookstore "The Book Nook" located on the Stuart Adult Community High School campus to pick up books.

- Students must return all previous semester Dual Enrollment books/materials to "The Book Nook" prior to registration of the next semester.
- Students must have their high school id.

Once classes begin, student must meet with high school counselor before changing his or her schedule.

Registration for IRSC

- Summer I paperwork must be completed by April 26, 2019
- Summer II paperwork must be completed by May 30, 2019

# Important Dual Enrollment Information

- Must attend IRSC student orientation either in person or online.
- May only take 2 Dual Enrollment classes during their first semester
- One of the first classes must be SLS1101- Student Success
- Students who receive a "F" or a "W" in a Dual Enrollment course will not be able to register for any additional IRSC courses until they have retaken and completed the course at their own expense or over the summer when tuition is not charged for Dual Enrollment.
- Students are allowed to earn a maximum of 60 credit hours through Dual Enrollment. Please contact your school counselor for more details.
- Students recommended for expulsion and assigned to an alternative school will be ineligible for Dual Enrollment while they are at the alternative school site.
- Students, not parents or the high school counselor, are to contact professors for any questions or concerns.
- **DEADLINE TO REGISTER FOR SUMMER 1 IS APRIL 26, 2019**

# SAT/ACT

- JBHS recommends students take at least one of these exams beginning in Spring of your junior year. You must create an account and register online to sign up for tests.
  - ACT [www.act.org](http://www.act.org)
    - Remaining test dates for this school year: April 13, June 8, July 13
  - SAT [www.collegeboard.org](http://www.collegeboard.org)
    - Remaining test dates for this school year: March 9, May 4, June 1
- If you receive free or reduced lunch at school you may qualify for 2 fee waivers for each test. Appropriate paperwork can be found in guidance to determine eligibility.
